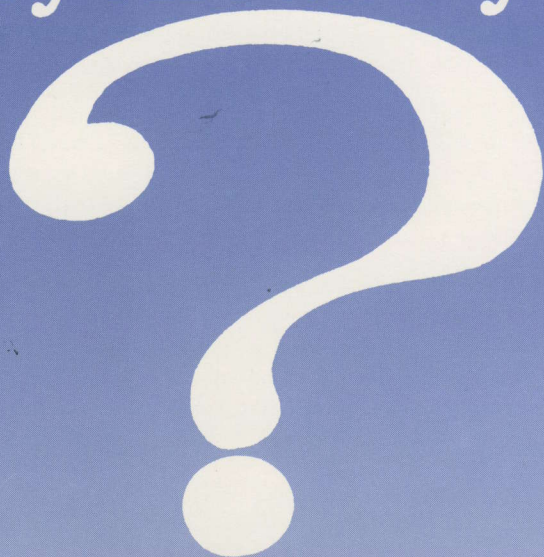


What is Psychoanalysis



The National Psychological Association for Psychoanalysis (NPAP) is one of the oldest and largest psychoanalytic institutions in the USA. It was founded in 1948 by Theodor Reik, one of Freud's students, who was denied full membership in the American Psychoanalytic Association because he did not possess a medical degree.

The NPAP Training Institute has preserved to this day the tradition of offering full psychoanalytic training to persons from all backgrounds and walks of life whose character, motivation, and desire for professional growth are commensurate with the vision of psychoanalytic practice held by Freud and Reik.

The name, NPAP, also refers to a collegial association of graduates and other psychoanalysts with equivalent training who are committed to fostering greater public understanding of psychoanalysis as well as preserving psychoanalytic principles in the treatment of patients.

The NPAP Training Institute is a member of the International Federation for Psychoanalytic Education, the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis, and the Council of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapists. NPAP is also a member of the World Federation for Mental Health.

The Psychoanalytic Review

NPAP publishes *The Psychoanalytic Review*, founded in 1913 as a journal of psychoanalytic psychology, which today contains commentary on the science of psychoanalysis, aspects of clinical practice, and the application of psychoanalytic principles to the understanding of culture and the arts. Manuscripts are submitted to NPAP. Subscriptions are placed with Guilford Publications at 212-431-9800.
